- * Xilinx Vivado tools and FPGAs, particularly Ultrascale/+ and Zynq
- * VHDL language for synthesis
- * PCB design tool such as KiCAD, Allegro, Altium

Experience in circuit assembly, fabrication and testing required. We believe that good technician skills are essential for success in engineering.
